Message from Murali Krishnamurthy

Dear Friends,

Very warm greetings from San Jose! How are our Sankara Eye Hospitals doing? We are happy to announce that in the first five months of 2010, we performed over 44,000 FREE eye surgeries at the seven eye hospitals directly run by us. One eye camp near Vinukonda (Andhra Pradesh) set a new record – 924 cases were identified for surgery from this one camp. Our Bangalore Hospital celebrated its second annual day this year in March.

Excellent processes have been set-up at our hospitals in India and the Apex body meets every quarter to look at productivity norms and key performance indicators for each of the Sankara hospitals and the institute as a whole. This year, our Krishnankoil Hospital in Tamil Nadu received the 'Performance Excellence Award'.

In the USA, fundraising events are happening all over the country and the Shreya Ghosal event at the Flint Center in the San Francisco Bay Area was a huge success. In June, I went to Washington D.C to attend a workshop organized by USAID, on how to apply for grants from them and was fortunate to be invited to a US India Strategic Alliance Reception organized by the Secretary of State at the State Department and had the opportunity to shake hands with President Barack Obama, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Indian External Affairs Minister S.M. Krishna.

As for our new projects in Punjab and Uttar Pradesh (UP), we are still working on identifying land for building a hospital in UP and the momentum for this project will pick up as soon as the land is identified. Focus Punjab project is progressing steadily and it can use a lot more momentum. We are very fortunate and very happy to inform you that Dr. A.S. Marwah hosted a fundraising banquet at his beautiful Malibu Ranch on July 24 for our upcoming Sankara Eye Hospital in Punjab.

Our friend, donor and supporter Anil Lal, is playing a major role in the Focus Punjab project. In addition to donating more than \$100,000 for this project, he is also organizing several fundraising dinners at his friends' homes. SEF teams in the San Francisco Bay Area. Central Vallev. Southern California, Seattle, New Jersey, New York and Washington D.C are working hard for this project. Punjabi Heritage Society promoted the Focus Punjab project at their Visakhi event in Pleasanton, California. Share a Smile Chicago promoted our Punjab project at their annual fundraiser on March 13 and raised \$9.000.

Our Founder & Managing Trustee, Dr. Ramani, visited Germany and UK in June and he motivated people in UK for the Punjab project. We organized a Press meet in Ludhiana in June that was well received.

The Punjab Hospital budget is ready and the cost of the project is around \$4.2 million. We have so far raised a little over \$800,000 and we need to raise over \$2 million to start the hospital construction. Land is ready, building architectural design is ready, construction tenders are being floated and we are ready to hire the paramedical staff from Punjab for their rigorous eighteen month training at Coimbatore. But, the construction can start only after we raise over \$2 million. It is completely in our hands when the construction can begin. One of the land lease conditions is that we need to complete the hospital in two years from now.



We are looking forward to overwhelming support from all of you, wherever you are in the USA, to help us start the Punjab Hospital construction by October this year and perform the FREE eye surgeries by early 2012. SEF Hospital Updates

The Sankara Eye Hospital, Bangalore, celebrated its second year anniversary with notable accomplishments. The hospital was awarded the "Namma Bengaluru Award 2009" for the best private institution that has made significant difference to the community vision health in Bangalore. For the past two years, it has restored sight for 18,000 rural poor and undertaken a special initiative called "Nanna Kannu" as a commitment to the youth community, through which it has screened 34,000 children for eye ailments.



The Sankara Eye Hospital, Anand is granted registration for Eye Bank & Corneal Transplantation by the Gujarat Government. The Eye Bank was inaugurated on June 21, 2010 and is

expected to create a sizeable eyeball deposit in Charotar region which has shortage of donated eyeballs. At the inauguration event, 23 guests gave a written pledges to donate their eyes.

The Sankara Eye Hospital, Guntur has achieved self sufficiency but the hospital is gearing up to increase the number of eye surgeries from the current 25,000 surgeries. The word of the great work done by the hospital is spreading and often the eye camps are attracting large crowds of almost 1,000 people, the highest attendance among all Sankara camps to date.

High-Quality, High-Volume Eye Care

Realizing the need for large volume corrective surgery, we have identified a rapid, cost-effective high-quality technique that provides rapid visual recovery. Today, the temporal small incision cataract surgery is known as the "Sankara" technique. Not only is the post operative astigmatism low, the absence of sutures and elaborate instrumentation makes it less symptomatic for the patient and affordable for the Institution. The success rate of cataract surgery at Sankara is more than 98.8%.

Robert Bosch Foundation: Strengthening Partnership

Robert Bosch Foundation is one of the key supporters of Sankara Eye Care Institutions, India and is involved in joint programs with Sankara Eye Hospital, Bangalore. In June 2010, Dr. Ramani, the Managing Director of the Sankara Eye Care Institutions, was invited to Germany as a guest of the Foundation in Stuttgart. Both the Chairman of the Foundation, Mr. Dieter Berg, and the Head of the Health Care Service Activities, Dr. Satrapa, met with Dr. Ramani during the visit. The Chairman reassured that the Foundation is extremely happy with Sankara and that they will continue to support the Sankara-Bosch Human Resource Development Program at Bangalore; with greater inputs during the coming years and have promised to visit the hospitals in India.

With the support of the Foundation, SECI will explore research work in low vision and age related macular degeneration that is happening in Tubelingen University in Germany. Sankara looks forward to strengthening this relationship with the Foundation.

Dr. Ramani was also invited to present a talk on "Comprehensive Eye Care – The Sankara Eye Foundation Model" at the World Ophthalmic Congress 2010 where 11,000 eye surgeons from all over the world participated. The 80:20 self-sustaining model fascinated everyone, especially those from Latin American and African countries. Also, a German equipment manufacturing company, Gueder Limited signed an MOU to keep all their new equipments at our Bangalore hospital for evaluation and training.



Steady Progress on the Punjab Express



The Focus Punjab project is picking up momentum towards its fundraising goal by raising over \$800K out of the \$2 million needed to start the construction. To meet the aggressive goal, Anil Lal, one of SEF's advisor, donor and patron is spearheading an effort to reach out to new donors and identify new leaders in various cities. SEF has nicknamed this effort as the **"Punjab Express"** which is visiting new places and meeting new people.

Punjab Express Stop 1: Yuba City. One of the first stops was Yuba City, California, which has a strong Punjabi community. SEF leaders like Uma Bangalore and Sonny Kalkat joined Anil Lal to talk with prospective donors and supporters, including Kashmir Gill, the Mayor of Yuba City. SEF attended the Punjabi Mela that had attracted nearly 10,000 people and plan to attend the Nagar Kirtan, which will have audience of more than 100,000; all this in an effort to spread the word about the Punjab hospital and raise funds for the construction.

Punjab Express Stop 2: Los Angeles. The next stop was in Southern California at the Mathya Samaj temple to meet with SoCal SEF volunteers. SEF-Southern California is gaining momentum with help of Harshad and Naina Uka, who have been major pillars of SEF for many years. With amazing efforts from Pradeep Chpra, Anju Desai helped organize a dinner with the donors of the Los Angeles region to thank them for their support for the Gujarat Hospital and to appeal for their support for the Punjab Hospital. During this dinner, Bhindi Jewelers formally adopted SEF as their family charity and has promised support in many ways; including advertising space, building space and even promised to fund research projects. In SoCal, Pradeep Chopra is leading the efforts for the Gurudwara initiatives.

States at Sittletar

Punjab Express Stop 3: Ludhiana, Punjab. The Punjab Express also made a stop in India to meet potential donors in Ludhiana. A Press and Donor Meet was conducted in Ludhiana on June 18th, organized by Vipul Builders that has leased two acres of land on Ferozepur Road at a nominal price to help Sankara set up the hospital. Mr. Jessie Singh, a key supporter of SEF, brought a number of prominent people to the Donor Meet in Ludhiana. Another key person joining the SEF movement is Mr. Ranjodh Singh, a prominent industrialist in Ludhiana and he mobilized meetings with senior educationalists, industrialists, ministers and the like. Many of the attendees expressed interest in the Sankara model and said that they would find a way to support the cause.

UK. After visiting Germany, Dr. Ramani, Managing Director of Sankara Eye Care Institutes, India, went to UK and met with the core group of volunteers of SEF-Europe. There he met Sir Mota Singh, who is the first judge of the Supreme Court of UK and the first person of Indian origin to receive the knighthood from the Queen. Sir Singh has promised to support our cause and to be the spokesperson for the Punjab project. During his visit, Dr. Ramani took his Sankara presentation to various groups, including the gurudwaras, "Think London" - a group of Indian CEOs, a Punjab Radio station etc. Dr. Ramani also met many supporters like Mr. Bala lyer, a media personality, who promised a media plan for SEF-EU. Mr. Arjun Waney, of the Mission for Vision, who promised a donation of Rs1,000,000 to Coimbatore hospital and yacht owners, Mr. Andrew and Mr. Biren; both promised to name their next boat "Sankara" and use it to raise funds. Dr. Ramani's trip has greatly energized the SEF-Europe volunteers.

Punjab Express Stop 5: Seattle.

Murali Krishnamurthy and Anil Lal recently returned from a very successful trip from Seattle. Amar Nalla, Arun Sharma, Sarabjit Singh, Vidya, and others are members of the SEF-Seattle team and driving the Focus Punjab efforts there. Murali and Anil Lal met the SEF volunteers at Microsoft, Taxi Union members, a few Truck owners and drivers and visited three gurudwaras. The two Taxi Unions have committed to raise \$10,000 each, the Truckers Union has also committed \$10,000. With one gurudwara committing to raise \$10,000 and another gurudwara may be raising \$100,000, it was indeed a very fruitful visit for the Punjab project. A small team of Punjabi community leaders is being formed to steer the fundraising efforts for the Punjab project.

Behind the Scenes: People Who Make it Happen by Dr. Rajat Chabba

Sukumaran: Our tireless and dedicated eye care field worker

We always discuss and hear about the work carried out at our Sankara Eye Hospitals and the amazing work carried out by the dedicated and talented staff and care givers but, we hardly hear about the hard working selfless people who spend their days in the hot sun traveling in public transport for many kilometers building sustainable relationships with the poor villagers. These are the people who do not come to the forefront but keep doing their job as a duty and form the back bone of what we do. They are our dedicated fieldworkers!

For a few days, I joined Sukumaran, a filed worker in Arni district of Tamil Nadu. Together, we explored the surrounding area and interacted with patients, identified those requiring surgery and counseled them to the best of our abilities. One day, I met a blacksmith

named Selvaraj, who was operated at Sankara six months back. After his operation, Selvaraj was quite content and happy with his vision; but his left eye also required operation. He, however, was re-

luctant to get the other eye operated as he was satisfied with vision in one eye and wanted to continue with his daily work and earn his living.

Sukumaran, continued to visit him every month persuading him to attend the camp and get the other eye operated. It took five months before Selvaraj agreed to get operated. Sukumaran convinced him through persistent counseling and made him understand the virtues of good and wholesome vision. He assured him about the same sensitive and humble treatment at the base hospital and helped him make the decision. The fact that Selvaraj, has now emerged as an opinion leader and a source for identifying more patients speaks volumes about the efforts of Sukumaran.

So, when said, that we at Sankara work for a movement and not any individual, it signifies the true spirit and dedication that is evident in the work of Sukumaran and many more like him.





Sneak Preview: Auto Publicity Campaigns

Sankara Eye Care Institutes in India, deploys highly successful Auto Publicity Campaigns as an effective means of spreading the information and reaching out to the local communities for the upcoming free eye camps.

An Auto Publicity Campaign requires a good conditioned auto rickshaw that can carry an enthusiastic eye camp field worker all day to help spread the word to surrounding villages and encourage villagers to attend. Utilizing loudspeakers, recorded messages are interspersed with local music to help draw villagers' attention to the information about the free eye camp - camp sponsors, venue details, date, emphasis on free nature of treatment and the nature of services provided.

Autos Campaigns are an integral part of the outreach eye camps and cover large areas in a single day.
